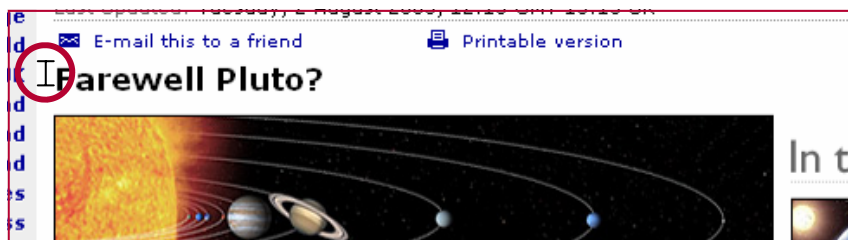


Beginners: Printing Part of a Web Page

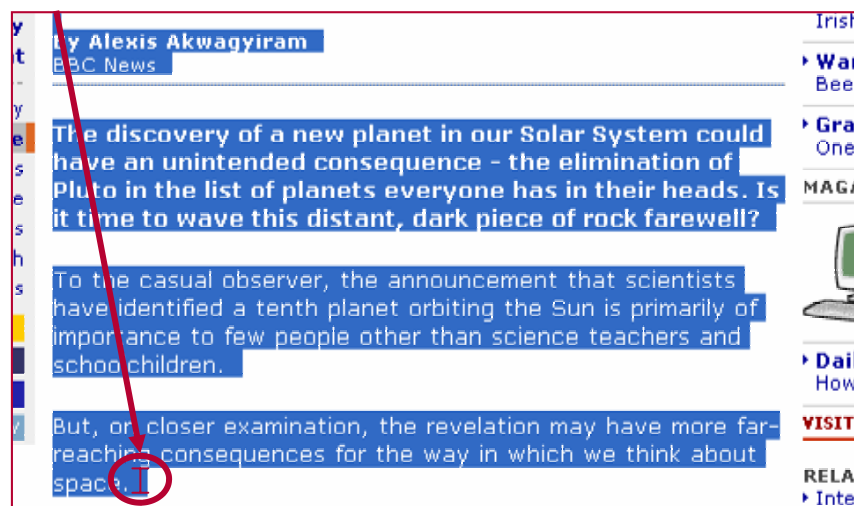
If you want more control over what is printed (for example, you might not wish to print all of the navigation or the adverts on the page), it is possible to select an area of the webpage and print that area alone.

1. Place the mouse pointer just before the start of the section you wish to print.

In the example I wish to start my selection at the title of the news article. Note that as the mouse pointer is near text it will look like a capital I



2. Click, hold and drag the mouse pointer directly to the end of the section you wish to print, and then release the mouse button.



This will highlight your selection in blue.

If you are not happy with your selection, click anywhere within it to deselect it and start again.

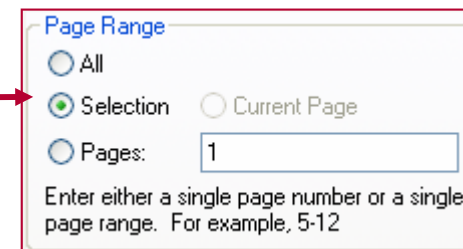
3. Ensure your selection is still highlighted

4. Click on the **File** menu.

5. Click on **Print...**

6. In the **Page Range** section, click on **Selection**

This will ensure that (at least 99% of the time...) only what you selected will be printed



7. Click on the **Print** button.

If the Web page you want to print uses **frames** (i.e. the browser display area is divided into two or more sections, the contents of which are taken from different Web pages), you have further printing options.

1. Click on the **File** menu

2. Click on **Print**

3. At the top of the **Print** dialogue box, click on the **Options** tab

4. Here you can choose to print the web page:

- As it appears on screen (all frames on the same page)
- Only the selected frame
- All frames individually

5. Click on the **General** tab.

6. Click on the **Print** button.
