



Beginners: e-Life: Booking Tickets Online

There are many websites that you can use to search for and purchase tickets online for musicals, plays, cinemas etc.

A simple search using the Google search engine, and the keywords **theatre tickets booking** or **cinema tickets booking** provides a range of website links for you to explore.

Alternatively, go to the www.uktw.co.uk website.

Click on the **What's On Search** link to search the UK-wide listings for theatre, opera, dance, plays, musicals and more. You can search for listings close to where you live by entering your postcode into the search box or you can search by venue, date, group or simply by keyword.

Alternatively go to the <http://uktw.eolts.co.uk> website. This website also offers ticket, hotel or meal deals for particular shows.

The whole website consists of links to information about particular productions for musicals, operas and plays. On the right are links to meal deals with tickets either before or after shows.


1. Click on the show you would like to see, e.g. *Woman in White*.

2. Click on the meal and ticket deal that best suits you.
3. Select how many tickets you would like to purchase and click on the **Check Availability** button for a list of available dates of shows.
4. Click on the **Book Package** link for the date you are interested in. The next page shows a summary of your package.
5. Click on the **Proceed to secure checkout** link.
6. Fill in your personal details on the form.
7. Agree to the terms and conditions.
8. Click the **Proceed to payment** button. Notice that the web page is secure  so you are safe sending payment.
9. 7. Click the on the **Make payment** button and you will get confirmation of your payment and a booking reference.
